week, they will be out at their prospective secondary schools for their transition visits.





#### Rose Theatre Trip

In preparation for their own end of year production, on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> July, Rye Class will be

travelling to York to enjoy a performance of "The Tempest" at Shakespeare's Rose Theatre. The theatre itself first "popped up" in York last year, but has returned for a second year. The Theatre is currently well under construction and

More than 400 years ago, the first audiences for Shakespeare's plays enjoyed an experience that was as intimate as it was exciting, crowded in close to the actors and the action, in a small theatre in the bustling city of London. In an experience every bit as exciting, intimate and immersive will be offered to 🖁 today's audience. The dramatic playhouse setting will pop-up beside the iconic 13th century Clifford's Tower in the heart of York.

The original Rose Playhouse was built in 1587 on the south bank of the River Thames in London. It was a slightly irregular 14-sided structure made of

> timber, with plaster exterior and a thatched roof, open in the centre to the elements. The success of The Rose Playhouse paved the way


for other theatres to be built in the area, including The Swan in 1595, The Globe Theatre in 1599 and The Fortune in 1600. A trip to the new Rose Theatre for Rye Class to see a professional production of the play that they themselves will be performing, in authentic surroundings, should be most inspirational, as well as a great opportunity.

The coach will be leaving school at 9.15am so that we can arrive in York and get to the Theatre for the 11.00am performance. Children will need to bring a packed


lunch with them, which they will be able to eat during the performance interval. Shakespeare's Rose Theatre is a temporary structure without air conditioning or heating; the temperature is dependent on the weather and seating is not covered so pupils will need to wear school uniform and may need a coat. We are aiming to

leave York at 2.30pm to return to school but cannot guarantee that we will be back in time for the school bus, so please make arrangements for your child to be picked up if they usually go home on school transport.

FoLS have very kindly agreed to pay £10 per pupil towards the cost of the trip, but we would be grateful for a voluntary contribution of £8.00 towards the cost of the transport to the Theatre. This will be added to your ParentPay account. Please use ParentPay to give your consent for your child to go on the trip, and to provide us with emergency contact details for that day by Friday 28th June at the latest.

#### We're going on a Bug Hunt....

Parents of Derwent and Foss Class pupils have this week received (by email) a letter from Mrs Laverack and Mrs C about the upcoming trip to Howsham Mill (on Monday 1st July) for some fun in the

sun (we hope!!).





As well as being a great chance to enjoy some fresh air in the beautiful North Yorkshire countryside, the purpose of the visit is to address many outdoor learning and forest schools opportunities for learning. As well as looking at local history in our community and science objectives for E.Y.F.S and KS1, the children are sure to have lots of fun! The Education Officer at the Mill will lead the children in bread making and baking and will also provide materials for den building. Mrs Laverack and Mrs C will facilitate a minibeast/flora and fauna hunt and also complete some observational drawings.

The coach will depart from Langton at 9:20am for the short journey down to Howsham Mill; and the children will be back in school by the end of the school day. All children will need to bring a packed lunch and a water bottle, and as they will be outdoors for the

majority of the day and the conditions surrounding the mill are wood and meadowland, it is essential that the children all have covered legs (trousers or leggings) not shorts and skirts; with school shirts and hoodies. Rain coats and wellingtons, boots or outdoor trainers are a must as everyone will need to walk to and from

different areas. Sun cream and hats are advised dependent on the weather.

Due to a generous contribution from FOLS there will be no charge for his visit as the transport costs have been met, but we ask all Derwent and Foss parents to give your permission for your child to attend and your emergency contact details for the day via ParentPay, no later than Monday 24th June. We would appreciate greatly, any family members (over 18's) who would be available to help supervise children on our visit. Please see either Mrs Laverack or Mrs Cummings if you are available.


