"The Cosmo-Dome is inflatable planetarium which we looked at the galaxy and constellations. In the welding session, we explored a VR (Virtual Reality) welding adventure.

"In the Royal Navy turbine workshop, we had tin-foil circles with slits in them and we had to bend and manipulate them into turbine-like structures and out them into a real Royal Navy shop turbine to see if they worked and what our score was. The lower the score was the better you did as the score showed how much fuel you were using.

"We all had a great day and got to try lots of different activities.!"
