"All Learning Together"

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We've had a very busy first week. It's been great to be back even if my boys, George and Sebbie, are on half term this week and I've left them snoozing happily in bed! The rain on Tuesday did not dampen spirits as the School set off for this year's Welly Walk. Jennie, Martha and Jasper Johnson had done a fantastic job of preparing a trail of pumpkins to follow and I know the children enjoyed not only spotting them on their way round, but squelching in all the mud along the way. My huge thanks go to Jennie Johnson and Mrs Howard-Vyse for helping us to get this organised and for making it the success that it was. Many thanks to all of you who



have so far sent in your sponsor money. Please could we ask that any remaining sponsor money be sent into school by Friday 10th November. We will then draw for the Flamingoland tickets in assembly on Monday 13th November.

On Wednesday morning, we had our first Stay and Play session for parents with pre-school children. Tammy, Helen and I were absolutely delighted with the turnout. We welcomed eight parents and their babies and toddlers, and coffee, cake and fun was had by all. This is now a weekly session and we hope to welcome as many families who are able to join us on Wednesday mornings between 9.30 and 11.30am, over the coming weeks.



Yesterday, we had a visit from Snappy the Crocodile and the author Anne Stamp. Anne works for the charity SNAPPY, which is based in York and provides opportunities for children with special needs. There is more information in the newsletter about this. This year, we will be supporting this charity. We have sent collection bags home this week for you to fill and return on Tuesday 14th November (by 9.00am). We have plenty more bags in school if you need

additional bags. The more bags we get means, not only more money goes to SNAPPY, but also a percentage comes to Langton School. We have also an aluminium collection box in the front entrance for clean foil, drinks cans and cables.

We are working hard behind the scenes to get our new website ready for launch on **Monday 13th November**. To celebrate, this will be a **Non-Uniform Day** and we ask that children come to school in our Langton primary colours found in our logo, of either red, yellow, blue or green, or a mixture of the above. It is also the time of year we are busy planning the Christmas Fair, so we ask on Monday 13th, that in return for wearing your own clothes, that children bring in a bottle for the Bottle Raffle (this can be any bottle from bottles of bubble bath to bottles of wine. If the bottles could be wrapped or put in a bottle bag, we would be very grateful) or a donation of chocolate or sweets for the Chocolate Tombola. Whatever donations you are able to give us for these Chocolate and Bottle Tombolas, we would be very grateful. Please do also watch out for our new website, that's looking really good.

Many thanks to everybody who returned Parent Questionnaires to school. Next week, on Tuesday 7th November at 2.30pm, we are holding a Parent's Forum in school where parents are invited to come along and meet with me to discuss school life and how things are going. If anybody has any matter that they would like discussing at this Forum, please email Sam and we will put it on the agenda. I do appreciate that this time is not convenient for everybody, but we have tried different times in the past and this one has been the most well-attended. If you are unable to make it, minutes will be taken of the meeting and put on the new website when it is launched.

Each fortnight in our newsletter, you will notice that we will have a section on our Class attendance. Over the past three years, it has been noted by the Authority that our attendance figures are dropping slightly, year on year. It is important that we encourage your child's attendance in school as much as possible. I do appreciate, especially at the moment, there is a lot of sickness which means that children cannot be in school, but an awful lot of our lack of attendance is down to unauthorised holidays so we appreciate your support with this. The Government expects attendance to be above 95% but you can see that, unfortunately, our attendance figures do not match this. Well done to Class 2 who have the highest attendance figures for the past fortnight.

....and this is where all our wonderful Langton bakers come in.... The School Council would be very grateful for any donations of cakes, buns and biscuits that they can sell on the day. Please



thank you to Anne and Snappy (Claire!) for coming and spending





If arrears start to build up on your account, we are required to supply this information to the Local Authority, who then take over management of the debt. Please ensure that dinners are paid for as soon as possible, as LA rules state that they should be paid for in advance, either weekly, half termly, or termly. After School Sports Club places for next term will also not be allocated to those still in arrears for this term's clubs, as this is a bought in service that the school has to pay for in advance.
