Dear Parents,

As you may be aware, the National Curriculum requires schools to deliver a puberty and growing up talk to Year 6 pupils. This is no longer a responsibility of the School Nurse. As a result, this year, the session will be delivered to the children by Mrs Ray and Mr Walker. We have taken advice from the school nurse team and will be using resources recommended by them. Part of the session will be delivered to the whole year group together, although there will be a time when Mr Walker will work with the boys and Mrs Ray will talk with the girls. This session will take place in school on Monday 8th July in the afternoon. The topic will cover the following aspects:

- What happens during puberty
- How boys bodies grow and develop during puberty
- How girls bodies grow and develop including menstruation
- How babies are made
- Enjoying growing up

The materials used are sensitively put together and the characters that are shown are animated drawings instead of real people. We will also talk to the groups and discuss most issues or answer any questions. If we feel that their questions are more appropriate for a home environment, we will encourage the children to discuss this with you at home. Any issues raised will be addressed with due regard to moral considerations and dealt with in the context of family life.

You may withdraw your child from this if you have any strong objections, and we would be grateful if you could put these in writing before Friday 28th June.
